

Le Mondial du Lion Equine Hall of Fame

Hildago de l'Île

Hildago de l'Île made history in 2008 as the first horse with a French rider to win Badminton, the mythical CCI five star held each year in May in Gloucestershire, England.

Hildago ran twice at the Mondial du Lion, finishing on his dressage score in third place as a six year old in 2001 and then winning the World Championship title for seven year olds in 2002.

He won his first five star at Pau in 2007 and also competed for the French national team at both the 2006 World Equestrian Games in Aachen and, at the age of seventeen years, at the 2012 London Olympics.

Hildago retired at the age of eighteen after winning that year's French national championship. He enjoyed a peaceful retirement at the home of his career-long rider Nicolas Touzaint and passed away in 2023 at the age of twenty eight.
